TRIBAL CONSULTATION ANNUAL REPORT July 1, 2014 – June 30, 2015

Agency Overview

Tribal Consultation Activities

The agency's mission is to promote quality construction by Arizona contractors through a licensing and regulatory system designed to protect the health, safety and welfare of the public.	The Registrar of Contractors (ROC) maintains jurisdiction over contractor's licenses issued by the ROC. However, if a complaint is received arising from work done on Tribal lands; the ROC will not enter Tribal lands unless permission is granted by the appropriate Tribal authority. ROC notifies Tribal authorities when a complaint is received from licensed contractor activity arising on tribal lands.	One complaint was received resulting from construction on Hualapai Tribal lands about non-payment This complaint is still open.
		Four complaints were received resulting from construction work on the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian community. Two were complaints about non-payment, one about labor questions, and one about abandonment. One complaint is still open and three are closed. Of the three closed, two were dismissed, and one was resolved.
		One complaint was received resulting from construction work on the Yavapai- Apache Nation complaining abandonment. The case is now closed, and the licensee received a disciplinary suspension.

There currently no recommendations from Tribal representatives.

There are no revisions to the Registrar of Contractors Tribal Consultation Policy at this time.
