Hopi Tribe Demographic Analysis

Introduction

This analysis of the Hopi Tribe was undertaken by the Arizona Rural Policy Institute (ARPI) in the W.A. Franke College of Business at Northern Arizona University for the planning department of the Hopi Tribe. The ARPI has produced the Demographic Profile for Hopi Tribe, with the latest information available from the 2010 Census and the 2010 American Community Survey (5-year estimates). This document is provided to Arizona tribes as a product of the EDA Technical Assistance Grant provided by the EDA to the ARPI at Northern Arizona University.

Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties. Therefore, this report incorporates two major data sources. First, the official 2010 Census, primarily from the SF1 data report to produce data on the population, age, race and ethnicity relative to Hopi Tribe. The second data source is the American Community Survey, 5-year estimate data for the period 2006 to 2010 and is annotated in the document as ACS 2010 (5-year estimates). The 2010 ACS 5-year estimates are based on data collected between January 2006 and December 2010. The data were used to analyze household income, poverty rates, employment, language use and household characteristics for Hopi Tribe. Only the 5-year estimates are used as the data was provided for small geographic areas, representing the average characteristics over the 5-year period.

The analysis of demographics for the Hopi Tribe first examines the 2010 Census and then the American Community Survey where data is available. Demographic characteristics are outlined by three separate levels, the State of Arizona, Navajo County and the Hopi Tribe. Comparisons between the State of Arizona and Navajo County serve to provide further levels of comparison when examining demographic characteristics of the tribe versus the County and the State. Navajo County was chosen as the reference county as a majority of Hopi tribal lands and communities fall within the County.

Appendix A contains official Census 2010 data and Appendix B contains American Community Survey data (5-Year Estimates) and Appendix C contains the margin of error estimates to be used to calculate the estimates for the American Community Survey data.

Population


The population of the Hopi Tribe grew moderately (3.4%) in the 2010 Census when compared to 2000 Census. This increase in tribal members, however, may not truly reflect the actual change in the tribe between the census periods, because this rate reflects growth by birthrate alone and not growth through in-migration as is the case with both the State and the County. The SF1 census is considered the official count, and accounts for only the population within the exterior boundaries of the tribal lands. Both the State (24.6%) and the County (10.2%) grew at much faster rates between the 2000 and 2010 Censuses.

Gender

There are more females (51.7%) than males (48.3%) within the Hopi Tribe. The gender ratios in the Hopi Tribe are lower for males in both the State (49.7%) and the County (50.0%). Females (51.7%) comprise a slightly larger proportion of the population among the Hopi Tribe tribal members than either the State (50.3%) or the County (50.0%).

Age


The Hopi Tribe is dominated by those under 18 years of age. The under-18 age group accounts for 31.9 percent of all tribal members, representing a larger proportion for that age group compared to the State (25.5%) or Navajo County (29.8%). The fact that one-third of the tribe is younger than 18 years of age carries with it important policy implications. The large portion of younger tribal members influences the provision of health and educational services as well as poverty and workforce issues as well.

On the other hand, the tribe has fewer members who are 65 years or older as a proportion of the total population. This age group, those who have retired and are out of the workforce account for only 11.0 percent of tribal members when compared to 13.8 percent for the state and 13.3 percent for the county. The Hopi Tribe have a similar age profile vis-à-vis other Arizona tribes, with a greater percentage of tribal members under age eighteen. Finally, those age 18 to 64 years account for 57.0 percent of the tribal members, which is lower than the State (60.7%) but the same as the County (57.0%). The large number of tribal young persons will have an effect on the development of the tribal workforce in the future. See Table 3, and Figure 1.


Figure 2. Age Cohorts for Arizona, Navajo County & the Hopi Tribe 2010



A population pyramid, also called an age structure diagram, is a graphical illustration showing the distribution of various age groups in a population – typically a country or region of the world – which forms the shape of a pyramid when the population is growing in all age groups.

The population pyramid below (Figure 3) illustrates the difference between males and females for 5-year age cohorts. The under-18 age cohorts are symmetrical indicating that there are an even number of males and females. At the top of the age pyramid there are more females than males. This is also a demographic reality as women tend to live longer than men. The age pyramid provides an illustrated snapshot of the age structure of the tribal members at the time of the 2010 census, showing large gaps in the 20-25 age group.

Population Under 18 Years

Children under 18 years of age account for 31.9 percent of all tribal members. There are 3,496 males and 3,689 female tribal members; 32.6 percent of males are under age 18 and 31.3 percent of females are under age 18. There are more females under age 5 years (34.0%) than males (33.5%), while the sex ratios are similar for those between 5 and 10 and 11 to 17 years of age. See Table 4.

Median Age

The median age (point that splits the population where 50% are above and 50% are below) for Hopi Tribe tribal members is 32 years, with males and females aged 31 and 33 years respectively. The median age of tribal members is lower than the State (36 years) and far lower than the County (48 years). This statistic serves once more to emphasize the overall younger age profile of the Hopi Tribe. See Figure 4.

Figure 4. Median Age in Years 2010



Race

Not surprisingly, the vast majority of Hopi tribal members identify themselves as American Indian or Alaska Native alone (95%), while the remaining 5 percent are split between white alone and multi-race persons. This stands in stark contrast to the State which is 73 percent white alone, and the County which is 49 percent white alone. See Table 6.


Ethnicity


Figure 5. Ethnicity

In terms of ethnicity, only a tiny percentage (1.9%) of Hopi tribal members self-identify as Hispanic or Latino. This is again quite different from both the State (29.6%) and the surrounding County where 10.8% percent of individuals self-identify as Hispanic or Latino. See Table 7 and Figure 5.

Households

In 2010, there were 2,081 households on the Hopi Tribe, with an average household size of 3.4 persons and an average family size of 4.0 persons. The average household size of 3.4 persons is larger than the State average (2.6 persons) and larger than the County average (2.9 persons). The average family size for tribal members (4.0 persons) is also larger than the State and the County, where the average is 3.2 and 3.5 persons respectively. See Figure 6.

The next portion of this analysis concerns households and their structure. The Census defines a "household" as a person or group of people who occupy a housing unit. The "householder" is a person in whose name the housing unit is owned, being bought, or rented. A "family household" consists of a householder and one or more people living together in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption — it may also include people unrelated to the householder. If the householder is married and living with his/her spouse, then the household is designated a "married-couple household." The remaining types of family households not maintained by a married couple are designated by the sex of the householder. A "nonfamily household" consists of a person living alone or a householder who shares the home with nonrelatives only; for example, with roommates or an unmarried partner.


Family households (74.5%) predominate on the Hopi Tribe, although traditional married couple families are in the minority (33.2%), at rates lower than the State (48.1%) or the County (49.1%). Households headed by a female head of household (single moms) account for one-third (32.1%) of all households. Almost two-thirds (65.3%) of all households are either married couple families (33.2%) or households headed by single mothers (32.1%). Other household structures include non-family households (25.5%), the majority of whom are unmarried partner households (13.4%). See Table 8 and Figure 7.

Unmarried partner households (13.4%) occur at a higher rate in the Hopi Tribe than at the State (7.8%) or the County (7.8%). Householder with a member over age 65 account for almost half (48.1%) of all households, higher than the (39.2%), and more than the State (26.4%). Finally, tribal households are more likely to be headed by a single mother with their own children under age 18 (12.3%) almost twice the rate of the State (7.1%) or the County (7.4%).

Figure 7. Household Relationships




In terms of household characteristics 29.0 percent of all households are headed by a householder, lower than the State (37.2%) or the County (33.2%). Spouse headed households comprise a minority of Hopi Tribe tribal households (9.6%) far less than the State (17.9%) or the County (16.30%). Children comprise about one-third of all households (31.9%), slightly higher than the State (28.9%) and the same as the County (32.0%). See Table 9 and Figure 8.

Family households dominate among Hopi Tribe tribal members (75%), compared to 66 percent for the State and the County (73%). Non-family households account for one-fourth (25%) of tribal member households, more than the State (34%) or County (27%). Husband and wife families account for half (44%) of households, whereas residents of the State (73%) and the County (68%) are more likely to live in husband and wife households. Households on the Hopi Tribe are three times more likely to be headed by a female householder (43%) with no husband present. Households headed by single mothers are far less prevalent at the State (12.4%) or County (17.1%) levels. Households on the Hopi Tribe are more likely (48%) to have children under the age of 18 living in the household, than the State (34%) and the County (39%). See Table 10 and Figure 9.

Figure 9. Households headed by single mothers




Children Under 18 Years of Age Living with Grandparent


Figure 10. Percentage of children under 18 living with a grandparent householder

Children under age 18 are four times more likely to live with grandparents on the Hopi Tribe (11.8%) than they are at the State (2.3%) or in the County (5.5%). There are few differences between the proportions of children by age living with grandparents, when comparing the Hopi Tribe to the State or the County. See Table 11 and Figure 10.

Presence of Multi-generational Households

Households on the Hopi Tribe are many times more likely to be multi-generational (20.1%), than are households in the State (4.9%) or the County (8.7%). The Census defines multi-generational families as family households consisting of more than two generations, such as a householder living with his/her children and grandchildren. Multi-generational family households may be more likely to reside in areas where new immigrants live with their relatives, in areas where housing shortages or high costs force families to double up their living arrangements, or in areas that have relatively high rates of out-of-wedlock childbearing. Figure 11. Presence of multigenerational households




Household Income

The median household income for the Hopi Tribe is \$34,016, less than the County (\$39,774) and less than the State (\$51,310). Tribal members are more likely to have lower household incomes than both the State and the County. One-fourth (28%) of all households on the Hopi Tribe have incomes of less the \$20,000 when compared to the State (17%), and the County (25%). Tribal members are more likely to have household incomes between \$20,000 and \$40,000 (29%) at roughly the same proportions as the County (25%) though higher than the State (22%). One fifth (21%) of tribal members have incomes in excess of \$60,000. See Table 12, and Figure 12.

Supplemental Income

Households on the Hopi Tribe are four times as likely (30%) to receive Food Stamps/SNAP than are residents of the State (10%) and the County (20%). Considerably more tribal members also (10%) receive public assistance income than do residents of the County (5%) and the State (2%). See Table 13 and Figure 13.

Figure 13. Supplemental Income



Other Income

Per capita Income on the Hopi Tribe (\$11,753) is lower than the per capita income for the County (\$16,745) and far lower than the State (\$25,680). Correspondingly, the median earnings for workers (\$20,735) is lower than that of the County (\$22,524) and the State (\$29,573). See Table 14.


Poverty

Poverty rates on the Hopi Reservation (35%) are more than twice as high as the State (15%) and higher than the County (24%) rates. Almost half (48%) of all children under 18 years of age are considered to be living in poverty, while less than one-third (28%) of tribal members between 18 and 64 also live in poverty. One-third (35%) of persons in families in poverty on the Hopi Tribe live below the poverty line, a higher rate than families in poverty at the state level (13%) or the County (23%). One-fourth of all persons over 65 years of age (23%) live in poverty, three times the State (8%) and twice the County (12%) poverty rates for this age group. See Table 15 and Figure 14.

Children in Poverty

The rates of children under 18 years of age living in poverty are twice as high for the tribe (35%) as the State (15%) or the County (24%). The highest poverty rates for tribal members are recorded for children between the ages of 6 and 17 years, of whom 24 percent of these school age children live below the poverty line. See Table 16.

Households in Poverty

The Census Bureau uses a set of money income thresholds that vary by family size and composition to determine who is poor. If a family's income is less than a family's threshold, then that family and every individual in it, is considered poor. Further the ratio of income to poverty can be used to measure the degree or depth of poverty. The ratio of income to poverty compares a person's income with their poverty threshold, and expresses the comparison as a fraction. For example, a poverty ratio of 1.0 (income at 100% of poverty level) means a person is living right at the poverty line; a ratio of 0.5 (income at 50% of poverty level) would mean that a person is living in a household making only half the income designated as the poverty threshold. The Census Bureau describes those with family incomes below one half of their poverty threshold as being "severely poor." People with incomes at or above their threshold but below 125 percent of their threshold are classified as "near poor."


One-third (35%) of those living on the Hopi Tribe are classified as "severely poor," with poverty ratios that ranges from below 0.5 to .99. These rates are twice those of the State (15%) and higher than the County (24%). A further 7 percent of tribal members are classified as "near poor" with poverty ratios between 1.00 and 1.24. These data indicate that 42 percent of Hopi households are living in poverty, while the remaining 58 percent are classified as not living in poverty. See Table 17 and Figure 15.

Households Receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

One-fourth (27.6%) of all households on the Hopi Reservation receive assistance from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). This rate is at least two times higher than the State (9.1%) and higher than the County (19.0%). Only a small percentage of households receiving SNAP assistance (6.3%) have at least one person in the household over 60 years of age. This rate is higher than the County (5.2%), and three times the State (2.0%) rate. See Table 18.

Fertility


The birth rate for women between the ages of 15 and 50 years for the Hopi Tribe is 8.3 percent, slightly higher than the County (6.7%) and the State (6.2%). The birth rate for unmarried mothers on the Hopi Reservation (8.8%) is about twice that of the State (4.3%) and County (5.4%) rate. See Table 19 and Figure 16.

APPENDIX C: THE HOPI TRIBE AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY 2010, 5-YEAR ESTIMATES MARGIN OF ERROR ESTIMATES

ACS Margin of Error Estimates

The ACS estimates are based on data from a sample of housing units and people in the population, not the full populations. For this reason, ACS estimates have a degree of uncertainty associated with them, called sampling error. In general, the larger the sample, the smaller the level of sampling error. The ACS calculates standard errors for each estimate produced and publishes the 90 percent confidence level margins of error (the Census Bureau standard). You can be 90 percent confident that the interval within the margin of error from the estimate includes the true value. Users can add and subtract the margin of error value from the estimate to find the top and bottom of the range within which the ACS is 90 percent confident in their estimate lies.

Understanding margin of error

A term you will often come across in survey research is "within the margin of error." Most people hear the term frequently during election season when results from polls are reported. Many surveys and polls collect data from a representative sample of a population to make determinations about a larger population. Results would be somewhat different each time the survey is administered to a different representative sample. The margin of error accounts for these differences by calculating an upper and lower boundary the true result would likely fall between if every member of population was surveyed.

For example, in the case of the Hopi Tribe the ACS has established that there are 2,223 households represented on the Hopi Reservation. The survey also indicates that there are 1,727 family households (families) with a margin of error of plus or minus (±) 6.4 percent and 77.7 percent of the respondents responding indicated that they were in fact family households. The margin of error tells us that if the same survey were administered to the Hopi Tribal members again, it is highly probable that the percent of "family household" responses would be between 71.3 percent and 84.1 percent, or 77.7 percent ± 6.4 percent.
