Introduction

This analysis of the Tonto Apache Tribe was undertaken by the Arizona Rural Policy Institute (ARPI) in the W.A. Franke College of Business at Northern Arizona University for the Grants & Contract Office of the Tonto Apache Tribe. The ARPI was asked to update the Demographic Profile for Tonto Apache, with the latest information available from the 2010 Census and the 2010 American Community Survey (5-year estimates). Once the American Community Survey (ACS) data estimates for the 5-year 2006-2010 series became available the RPI completed the analysis, which follows in the document.

Although the American Community Survey (ACS) produces population, demographic and housing unit estimates, it is the Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program that produces and disseminates the official estimates of the population for the nation, states, counties, cities and towns and estimates of housing units for states and counties. Therefore, this report incorporates two major data sources. First, the official 2010 Census, primarily from the SF1 data report to produce data on the population, age, race and ethnicity relative to Tonto Apache. The second data source is the American Community Survey, 5-year estimate data for the period 2006 to 2010 and is annotated in the document as ACS 2010 (5 year estimates). The 2010 ACS 5-year estimates are based on data collected between January 2006 and December 2010. The data were used to analyze household income, poverty rates, employment, language use and household characteristics for the Tonto Apache Tribe. Only the 5-year estimates are used as the data was provided for small geographic areas, representing the average characteristics over the 5-year period.

The analysis of demographics for the Tonto Apache Tribe first examines the 2010 Census and then the American Community Survey where data is available. Demographic characteristics are outlined by three separate levels, the State of Arizona, Gila County and the Tonto Apache Tribe. Comparisons between the State of Arizona and Gila County serve to provide further levels of comparison when examining demographic characteristics of the tribe versus the County and the State.

Appendix C in this document contains the margins of error used to calculate the estimates for the ACS.

Population


The Tonto Apache Tribe declined at a rate of 9.1% between the last census in 2000 and 2010. The rate of population growth is lower than both the State and Gila County. The SF1 census is considered the official count, and accounts for only the population within the exterior boundaries of the Tonto Apache tribal lands. This rate reflects growth by birthrate alone and not growth through in-migration as is the case with both the State and the County.

Gender

There are more males (55%) than females (45%) within the Tonto Apache Tribe. The gender ratios in the State and Gila County are identical to each other.

Age

The Tonto Apache Tribe is dominated by those between 18 and 64 years. The under-18 year population accounts for 34.2 percent of all tribal members, representing a far larger portion of tribal members than the same age group does for the State (25.5%) and Gila County (21.4%). The fact that more than one-third of the tribe is younger than 18 years of age carries with it some fairly important policy implications. The large portion of younger tribal members influences the provision of health and educational services as well as poverty and workforce issues as well.


On the other hand, the tribe has fewer members who are 65 years or older. This age group, those who have retired and are out of the workforce, account for only 6.7 percent of tribal members when compared to 13.8 percent for the state and 23.2 percent for the county. Once more, the reduction at the very bottom of the age cohort indicates the overall youthful profile of the tribe. Finally, those age 18 to 64 years account for 59.2 percent of the tribal members, which compares favorably to the State (60.7%) and the County (55.4%). The large number of tribal young persons will have an effect on the development of the tribal workforce in the future. See Table 3 and Figure 1.


Figure 2. Age Cohorts for Arizona, Gila County & Tonto Apache Tribe 2010



A population pyramid, also called an age structure diagram, is a graphical illustration that shows the distribution of various age groups in a population (typically that of a country or region of the world), which forms the shape of a pyramid when the population is growing.

The population pyramid below (Figure 3) illustrates the difference between males and females for the 5-year age cohorts. The under-18 age cohorts are somewhat symmetrical indicating that there are a somewhat even number of males and females. The population between 20 and 21 years of age are almost missing from the distribution. At the top of the age pyramid there are more females than males. This is also a demographic reality as women tend to live longer than men. The age pyramid provides an illustrated snapshot of the age structure of the tribal members at the time of the 2010 census.

Population Under 18 Years

Children under 18 years of age account for 34 percent of all tribal members. Of the 66 males and 54 female tribal members, 38 percent are males under age 18 and 30 percent are females under age 18. There are more females under age 5 years (25%) than males (24%), while there is parity between those aged between 5 and 10 years, 32% respectively; there are slightly more males (44%) than females (38%) aged 11 to 17 years. Median Age

The median age (point that splits the population where 50% are above and 50% are below) for the Tonto Apache tribal members is 26.7 years, with males slightly younger at 25.3 years and females older at 30.5 years. The median age of tribal members is considerably lower than the State (35.9 years of age) or the County 47.9 years. This once more serves to emphasize the overall younger age of tribal members. See Figure 4.

Figure 4. Median Age in Years 2010



Race

Not surprisingly, the majority of Tonto Apache tribal members identify themselves as American Indian or Alaska Native alone (67%), while the remaining 34 percent are split between white alone (18%), some other race alone (8%), and multi-race (8%). This stands in strong contrast to the State which is 73 percent white alone, and the County which is 77 percent white alone. See Table 6.

Ethnicity


In terms of ethnicity, about 12 percent of Tonto Apache tribal members identify themselves as Hispanic or Latino. This is lower than the surrounding County where about 18 percent identify themselves as Hispanic or Latino and lower than the State where 29.6 percent identify themselves as Hispanic or Latino. Households

In 2010, there were 40 households in the Tonto Apache Tribe, with an average household size of 3.0 persons and an average family size of 3.5 persons. The average household size of 3.0 persons is the same as the State average (3.0 persons) and more than the County average (2.4 persons). The average family size for tribal members is also larger than the State and the County, where the average for each is 3.0 persons. See Figure 6.

A “household” is a person or group of people who occupy a housing unit. The “householder” is a person in whose name the housing unit is owned, being bought, or rented. A “family household” consists of a householder and one or more people living together in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption — it may also include people unrelated to the householder. If the householder is married and living with his/her spouse, then the household is designated a “married-couple household.” The remaining types of family households not maintained by a married couple are designated by the sex of the householder. A “nonfamily household” consists of a person living alone or a householder who shares the home with nonrelatives only; for example, with roommates or an unmarried partner.


Family households (70.0%) predominate on the Tonto Apache reservation, although traditional married couple families are in the minority (42.5%) lower than the State (48.1%) or the County (48.6%). About half (52.5%) of all households are either married couple families (42.5%) or households headed by single mothers (10.0%). Other household structures include non-family households (30.0%) and unmarried partner households (12.5%). See Table 8 and Figure 7.



Unmarried partner households (12.5%) occur at a higher rate than the State or the County where this type of household relationship occurs 7.8 and 7.1 percent, respectively. On the other hand, Tonto Apache tribal members are just as likely (22.5%) to live alone as are households at the State level (26.1%) or the County (29.3%). Householders over 65 account for a much smaller percentage of the tribal population (10.0%) than similar age cohorts in the State (23.5%) and County (37.1%) populations. Finally, tribal households are more likely to have households with children under age 18 (47.5%) than are the State (33.6%) or the County (25.3%).

Figure 7. Household Relationships




In terms of household characteristics, 33.3 percent of all households are headed by a householder, lower than the State where 37.2 percent of households are headed by a householder and the County where 41.0 percent of households are headed by a householder. Spouse-headed households comprise a minority of Tonto Apache tribal households (14.2%), less than the State (17.9%) or the County (20.0%). Children comprise about one-third of all households (31.7%), greater than the State (28.9%) or the County (23.2%). Households on the Tonto Apache Tribe more likely to contain other relatives (13.3%) than are households in the State (7.3%) or the County (8.5%). See Table 9 and Figure 8.

Family households dominate among Tonto Apache tribal members (70%), compared to 66 percent for the State and 65 percent for the County. Non-family households account for 30 percent of Tonto Apache tribal households and more for the State (34%) or County (35%). Husband and wife families account for two-thirds (61%) of households, whereas residents of the State (73%) and the County (75%) are more likely to live in husband and wife households. When considering non-family households alone, households headed by single mothers account for 73 percent of this classification. Finally, households on the Tonto Apache Tribe are more likely (48%) to have children under the age of 18 living in the household, than the State (34%) and the County (25%). 

Children Under 18 Years of Age Living with Grandparent


Children under age 18 are less likely to live with grandparents on the Tonto Apache Tribe (0.1%) than they are at the State (2.3%) or in the County (0.2%). There are few differences between the proportions of children by age living with grandparents; the exceptions are that no children aged 3 to 5 years live with grandparents on the Tonto Apache Tribe. 
Figure 10. Percentage of children under 18 living with a grandparent householder



Presence of Multi-generational Households

Households on the Tonto Apache Tribe are just as likely to be multi-generational (5.0%) as the State (4.9%) and the County (5.0%). The Census defines multi-generational families as family households consisting of more than two generations, such as a householder living with his/her children and grandchildren. Multi-generational family households may be more likely to reside in areas where new immigrants live with their relatives, in areas where housing shortages or high costs force families to double up their living arrangements, or in areas that have relatively high rates of out-of-wedlock childbearing. Household Income


The median household income for the Tonto Apache Tribe is \$16,667, far less than both the County (\$37,580) and the State (\$50,448). Tribal members are more likely to have lower household incomes than either the State or the County. In fact, households are about three times more likely to have incomes less the \$20,000 (71.0%) than are residents of the State (17.0%) and the County (24.0%). No tribal members have household incomes between \$20,000 and \$40,000, versus the State at 22.0%. Correspondingly, tribal households are much less likely (14.0%) to have incomes over \$60,000 than the State (42.0%) and the County (27.0%). See Table 12 and Figure 12.

Supplemental Income

No households on the Tonto Apache Tribe receive Food Stamps (0%), compared to the residents of the State (10%) and the County (12%). They also do not receive public assistance income (0%), compared to the State (2%) or the County (3%). They also do not receive retirement income (0%), compared to the State at large (19%) and the County (30%). The only assistance that households on the Tonto Apache Tribe receive is Social Security income (29%), equal to the State (29%) but much less than the County (46%). See Table 13 and Figure 13.

Figure 13. Supplemental Income



Other Income

Per capita income on the Tonto Apache Tribe (\$9,977) is about half of the per capita income of the County (\$19,600) and the State (\$25,680). Correspondingly, median nonfamily incomes (\$12,083) fall far below the County (\$22,692) and the State (\$33,033). There is a huge gap between median earnings for male full-time year round workers (\$0) and females (\$16,458) due to the fact that there are no male full-time, year-round workers. See Table 14.

Poverty


Poverty rates on the Tonto Apache Tribe (52%) are more than three times the State (15%) and the County (19%) rates. Almost two-thirds of the children under 18 years of age (65%) are considered to be living in poverty, while almost half (48%) of those between 18 and 64 also live in poverty. None (0%) of tribal members over 65 years of age live in poverty, much less than the State (8%) and the County (10%) rates. Correspondingly high numbers of families (62%) live in poverty. Children in Poverty

The poverty rates for children under 18 years of age are much higher for the tribe (52%) than for the State (15%) or the County (19%). The most persistent poverty rates are for school-aged children between the ages of 6 and 17, where the tribe has a much higher rate (71%) versus the State (23%) and the County (19%). See Table 16.

Households in Poverty

The Census Bureau uses a set of money income thresholds that vary by family size and composition to determine who is poor. If a family’s income is less than a family’s threshold, then that family and every individual in it, is considered poor. Further the ratio of income to poverty can be used to measure the degree or depth of poverty. The ratio of income to poverty compares a person’s income with their poverty threshold, and expresses the comparison as a fraction. For example, a poverty ratio of 1.0 (income at 100% of poverty level) means a person is living right at the poverty line; a ratio of 0.5 (income at 50% of poverty level) would mean that a person is living in a household making only half the income designated as the poverty threshold. The Census Bureau describes those with family incomes below one half of their poverty threshold as being “severely poor.” People with incomes at or above their threshold but below 125 percent of their threshold are classified as “near poor.”


About half of all households (52%) on the Tonto Apache Tribe have a poverty ratio of between 0.5 and .99, a rate that is five times higher than that of the State (8%) or the County rate (9%). A further 20 percent of tribal member are classified as “near poor” with poverty ratios between 1.00 and 1.24, four times the rate of the State (5%) or County (6%). See Table 17 and Figure 15.

Households Receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

No households (0%) on the Tonto Apache Tribe receive assistance from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), compared to the State (9.1%) or the County (10.7%). The proportion of elderly, those over 60 years of age, receiving SNAP assistance (0%) is much lower than the proportion for the same age groups at the State (1.9%) and County (2.5%) levels. 
Fertility

The birth rate for women between the ages of 15 and 50 years is lower for the Tonto Apache Tribe (0%) than for the State (6.2%) or the County (7.2%). The proportion of unmarried women giving birth on the Tonto Apache Tribe (0%) is less that of the State (4.3%) and the County (6.7%). The births-per-1000 for women between the ages of 20 and 34 is nonexistent on Tonto Apache (0 births per 1000 women) as the State (112) or the County (140). See Table 19 and Figure 16.

ACS Margin of Error Estimates

The ACS estimates are based on data from a sample of housing units and people in the population, not the full populations. For this reason, ACS estimates have a degree of uncertainty associated with them, called sampling error. In general, the larger the sample, the smaller the level of sampling error. The ACS calculates standard errors for each estimate produced and publishes the 90 percent confidence level margins of error (the Census Bureau standard). You can be 90 percent confident that the interval within the margin of error from the estimate includes the true value. Users can add and subtract the margin of error value from the estimate to find the top and bottom of the range within which the ACS is 90 percent confident in their estimate lies.

Understanding margin of error

A term you will often come across in survey research is "within the margin of error." Most people hear the term frequently during election season when results from polls are reported. Many surveys and polls collect data from a representative sample of a population to make determinations about a larger population. Results would be somewhat different each time the survey is administered to a different representative sample. The margin of error accounts for these differences by calculating an upper and lower boundary the true result would likely fall between if every member of population was surveyed.

For example, in the case of the Tonto Apache Tribe the ACS has established that there are 28 households represented on the Tonto Apache Reservation. The survey also indicates that there are 18 family households (families) with a margin of error of plus or minus (\pm) 44.4 percent and 64.3 percent of the respondents responding indicated that they were in fact family households. The margin of error tells us that if the same survey were administered to the Tonto Apache Tribal members again, it is highly probable that the percent of "family household" responses would be between 19.9 percent and 100 percent, or 64.3 percent \pm 44.4 percent.
